### **Our Central Purpose – Part 3**

#### Rom. 6:6, 10-13.

- -If after continually confessing our sins, and yielding ourselves over and over to the Lord we still find we are not walking in the resurrection power of the Spirit, only one thing could be wrong.
  - •We do the yielding, pursuing, etc., <u>for</u> ourselves and not UNTO HIM.
- -We are <u>still living self-centeredly because now</u> we see the cross as nothing more than a way to <u>be self-fulfilled</u>...the <u>focus is still on SELF on not on HIM and HIS desire</u>.

# Our Central Purpose – Part 3

### Rom. 6:6, 10-13.

- -The preaching of the cross has been corrupted by the harlot system to make it the place to get all God has FOR ME, possessing all MY POSSESSIONS, and getting MY INHERITANCE in Christ.
  - •Hidden behind most pleading for deliverance and healing is what I want and need and not what HE desires.
- •The scripture is clear when we seek Him first, all these things are added!

### Our Central Purpose – Part 3

The "new" cross says, "Come and get." And a selfish human would be entirely contrary to his own nature if he refused. Of course, he will use the cross for his own benefits. Whereas the old rugged cross says, "Come and give," and for the moment entirely ignores anything that the individual shall receive, save a baptism into death...God has only intended that this Christian life shall be based on this one principle: The new life is lived not unto self, but unto God (2 Cor. 5:14)...
